

Figure 25. Demand for family planning satisfied by modern methods, married or in-union women aged 15–49 years, 2010–2015




Figure 25. Demand for family planning satisfied by modern methods, married or in-union women aged 15–49 years, 2010–2015




Figure 25. Demand for family planning satisfied by modern methods, married or in-union women aged 15–49 years, 2010–2015






Figure 25. Demand for family planning satisfied by modern methods, married or in-union women aged 15-49 years, 2010-2015


Figure 44. Proportion of women aged 20-24 who were first married or in union before age 18, 2010-2016


Figure 43. Proportion of individuals who believe that it is never justifiable for a man to beat his wife, 2010–2014


Figure 39. Housework and childcare indices of inequality


Figure 39. Housework and childcare indices of inequality
